

## PARENT CHALLENGE

As number continues to be one of our areas of focus we would like to challenge parents to set different number challenges at home for their child/ren. Here are a number of ideas.

- Number hunt in the environment, asking children to point out and identify numbers they see on days out.
- Cooking with children, looking at packaging and pointing out the different numbers you see in regards to ingredients etc.
- Numbers in messy play, exploring the numbers and identifying them alongside the children.
- Counting during everyday situations for example counting the stairs as you walk down them.
