NURSERY OPEN/CLOSING TIMES

Late fees are now being issued to parents arriving after 6pm. If you child only attends a morning session then the collection time is 1pm. Any parent collecting after this time will also be charged. The afternoon session starts at 1.30pm, any parent dropping off before this time will be charge for the early drop off. Thanks for your co-operation on this matter

RESOURCES

2 Year funding

CHILDREN'S PROGRESS

We have recently tracked all of our children's current levels of development and have completed a full analysis of this. The main outcomes were:

Strengths

99% of children are meeting age related expectations in Listening and Attention 99% of children are meeting age related expectations in Moving and Handling 99% of children are meeting age related expectations in Managing Feelings and Behavior 99% of children are meeting age related expectations in Making Relationships We are very proud of our achievements in the prime areas of learning as we are exceeding local and national averages

Areas for improvement

Our main area for improvement is Numbers. Although we are exceeding the local average for Liverpool, we are not quite reaching the national average. This will be our main focus for this term.

30 FREE CHILDCARE HOURS

If your child/ren will become eligible for funded 30 hours child care from April and you wish to increase your days please come and speak to me as soon as possible. You will need to apply for your code over the next few weeks to ensure that you don't miss the deadline date. 31stMarch. Anyone that does miss it will have to wait for the next term to start in September 2019. Please come and speak with me if you require any more information on this. MATHS CHAMPION

As maths is one of our areas for improvement, we have recently signed up to a maths champion course.

Our EYT/EYFS Manager Fern has joined NDNA's award winning Maths Champions programme. This will help build the team's confidence in maths through structured activities and online training. It is:

- Initially a year-long programmed, with the option to extend
- It is led by your 'champion' member of staff to build their confidence in maths
- Practitioners can then further support your children in gaining a stronger foundation in maths from birth upwards.



ROOM NEWS

BUMBLE BEES

Bumble Bees have been taking part in lots of physical development activities helping the babies to pull themselves up onto furniture and encouraging the older children in the room to walk. This has been helping the children to build strength in their legs. We have also been taking part in lots of sensory play, exploring dried cornflakes, coco powder, and play dough.

The children then split up into groups and performed the play exceptionally well in front of the parents. During the month we also practiced our writing skills, while writing letters to Santa and Christmas cards to our friends.
