

HONEY POT EY LOG

Over the past few weeks we have been experiencing some problems with the children's photographs being cropped on the EY log app. We have notified the company and they are working hard to resolve this. Please remember that you can send home observations through your child's eyLog. This is a great way to share your child's development with the nursery staff and also to ensure that learning developments are not being missed. Please feel free to speak to me or a member of staff should you require support with this.

NURSERY OPEN/CLOSING TIMES

Unfortunately, we are still experiencing a high number if parents arriving late to collect their child/ren, can we please remind you that the nursery opens at 8am closes at 6pm. Please do not enter the building until 8am as we are not insured before. Please collect by 5.50pm to give enough time to enter the building and receive a handover from your child/ren's key person. Late fees are now being issued to parents arriving after 6pm. If your child only attends a morning session then the collection time is 1pm. Any parent collecting after this time will also be charged. The afternoon session starts at 1.30pm, any parent dropping off before this time will be charged for the early drop off. Thanks for your co-operation on this matter

30 FREE CHILDCARE HOURS

If your child/ren will become eligible for funded 30 hours child care from April and you wish to increase your days please come and speak to me as soon as possible. You will need to apply for your code over the next few weeks to ensure that you don't miss the deadline date. 31stMarch. Anyone that does miss it will have to wait for the next term to start in September 2019. Please come and speak with me if you require any more information on this. 2 Year funding

EASY-PEASY PROGRAM

We have been lucky enough to be chosen to take part in an "easy-peasy" program to help develop children's communication and language. The program will start on 9th March for 20 weeks and is aimed at children between 2&4yrs. Each week you will be sent a new activity to carry out at home with your children. You are able to feedback to us what your thoughts are and the development it has had on your child. We can't wait to get started and see the difference this will make.

ECO-SCHOOLS

We have recently completed the bronze award for ECO-Schools. We have a number of members on the committee including staff, children and parents, and would be very grateful if any other parents would like to join. If this is something that you feel you could help with please speak to a member of staff. We have the actions plans displayed around the nursery if you would like more information. We are currently working towards our silver award.

CHILDREN'S PROGRESS

We have recently tracked all of our children's current levels of development and have completed a full analysis of this. The main outcomes were:

Strengths

- 93% of children are inline or above in understanding.
- 99% of children are inline or above in self-confidence & self-awareness
- 89% of children with SEN are inline or above in using media and materials
- 100% of children with SEN are inline with people and their communities
- We are above national and local average in all areas of learning

Areas for improvement

 Our upcoming focus is number especially with our boys as our data shows out children are needing most support in this area

MESSAGE FROM CENTRAL SUPPORT

We are currently undertaking training to enable us to have PANCo's in each of our nurseries. These are Physical Activity and Nutrition Co-Ordinator's. The introduction of these coordinators will enable us to further improve the provision for physical activity, support parents to understand the importance of physical activity and further build on our already outstanding nutritional meals. BUMBLE BEES

We have used a wide range of materials to do this. We have made lots of progress with our writing skills and number recognition over the past few weeks.
