

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Message from central support

Due to feedback received from staff and parents we have been looking for alternative childcare software to replace eyLog. Although eyLog has provided us with lots of benefits we have found that some aspects of it don't meet our needs and the needs of our parents. We have spent time researching a system which we feel will be more beneficial and have opted to change to Family. This change won't happen immediately. Our core team are currently spending time on getting it ready for a smooth transition which we will happen in March. There is nothing you need to do at the moment and when the transfer is happening you will receive an email to sign up to Family. We hope that you find this system more useful and we encourage you to give us your feedback once it's up and running. Reminders & Other News

* An eco-schools meeting was recently held by Sarah-Louise. It was only a small turnout via zoom but it was lovely to gain parents feedback on the eco-schools award & contribute their ideas also. If you were unable to attend the meeting, Sarah-Louise posted the minutes of the meeting on our parent facebook page. If you would like any further information on eco-schools, please contact Sarah-Louise.

* Please remember that if your child is eligible for 30 hours it is important to renew your code every three months, failure to do so can result in losing your funding entitlement.

* We have a parent's group on Facebook, please search **Honey Pot Aigburth Parents** to request to join. Staff are sharing lots of ideas & challenges! Also don't forget to follow Honey Pot's main social media pages too for lots of ideas & updates.

* **Extra sessions** - Please be aware that when booking any extra/additional sessions for your child/ren, they must be paid for in advance of the session.

* **Late collection** - Please be aware that morning sessions finish at 1pm and afternoon and full day sessions finish by 6pm. Please ensure you are collecting your children on time or you may be likely to incur a late collection charge.

Other Information

**** Just a reminder to be aware of the measures that are in place at nursery due to covid-19:**

* All parents must wear a mask when dropping up and picking up their children (Unless exempt) & use the one way system, the children will wash their hands upon arrival, have their temperature checked (Unless parents have stated otherwise) and be taken to their play rooms by a member of staff.

* To limit the time spent in contact with staff at the front door, handovers to parents will be strictly limited, staff will send out messages/diaries on eylog or call you if they wish to discuss anything with you or pass more information on.

* We encourage parents to post an observation via eylog or ring through to your child/ren's room if you wish to speak to a member of staff/pass on information, please be aware that staff do not see the messages section of eylog.

* In addition to this, please remember that children's accident forms & medication forms are completed on eylog; if your child has an accident in nursery you will get a notification.

* Please remember it is highly important to inform staff if your child has had any medicine or accidents prior to nursery, you can do this via eylog, informing the staff on handover or by calling the nursery.

* As per our covid-19 policy, we will not be administering calpol to children in nursery, this is due to a high temperature being a covid symptom & calpol could mask this symptom.
