Staff Information



* Please remember that if your child is eligible for 30 hours it is important to renew your code every three months, failure to do so can result in losing your funding entitlement.



* **Extra sessions** - Please be aware that when booking any extra/additional sessions for your child/ren, they must be paid for in advance of the session.

* **Late collection** - Please be aware that morning sessions finish at 1pm and afternoon and full day sessions finish by 6pm. Please ensure you are collecting your children on time or you may be likely to incur a late collection charge.

Covid-19 Procedures

- ** Just a reminder to be aware of the measures that are in place at nurseery due to covid-19;**
- * All parents must wear a mask when dropping off and picking up their children (Unless exempt) & use the one-way system, the children will wash their hands upon arrival, have their temperature checked (Unless parents have stated otherwise) and be taken to their play rooms by a member of staff.
 - * Please remember it is highly important to inform staff if your child has had any medicine or accidents prior to nurseery, you can do this via Family, informing the staff on handover or by calling the nurseery.
 - * As per our covid-19 policy, we will not be administering calpol to children in nurseery, this is due to a high temperature being a covid symptom & calpol could mask this symptom.
