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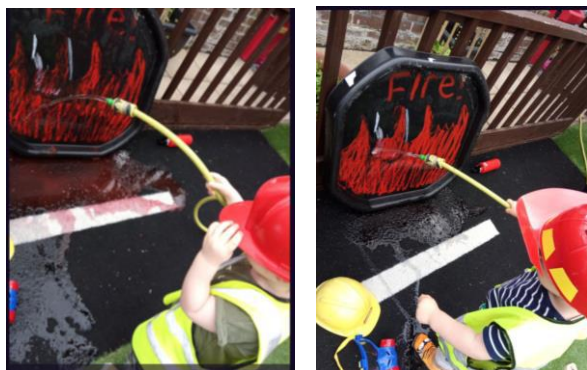
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Room News: Bumble Bees:

Important information: Funding

30 hours – Don't forget to renew your eligibility code every 3 months as required. Also, if your child has or is turning 3 between April and 31st August, you can apply online for 30 hours. If you would like to up your child's days, please speak to Carla.

Message from central support:

As you are probably aware the government has announced a 4-week pause at Step 3 of the lifting coronavirus restrictions. Step 3 restrictions remain in place. We appreciate that it can be tiresome to continue to follow the restrictions in place but we must urge you to do so for the safety and welfare of yourselves and others. As a reminder can you please ensure that you are wearing an appropriate face covering on drop off and collection, unless you are exempt. Please also ensure that you are keeping a 2 metre distance when queuing at the door on drop off and collection. We continue to work in bubbles within the building and staff wear face coverings where appropriate.

We also ensure that children and staff are regularly handwashing and would urge you to continue to use the hand sanitizer made available to you by the entrance. If you or your child have any symptoms please ensure you book a PCR test rather than taking a lateral flow test as we will only be able to accept a PCR result following symptoms. We are aiming to minimise potential disruption to children and avoid the need for isolating bubbles so your ongoing cooperation is much appreciated. We will provide more updates to any changes following government guidance which we expect to change on 19th July. Thanks again for your patience and understanding.
